

# Directions to Olney



## Location

Olney is a very pretty, lively market town situated on the A509, 11 miles north of Milton Keynes and 11 miles south of Wellingborough. It is 6 miles north of Junction 14 of the M1. Olney House is a prominent three-storey building on the western side of the High Street.

## By Train

Olney is served by four stations, all around 11 miles from the town: Milton Keynes and Northampton on the Euston line, and Bedford and Wellingborough on the St Pancras line. Taxis from these stations cost in the region of £15. Buses from the station are somewhat rare.

## Bus and Coach

Coaches from a huge range of destinations stop at Milton Keynes Coachway station at Junction 14 of the M1, about 6 miles from town. Buses to Olney run infrequently, and taxis cost around £10.

## By Car from the M1


Leave the M1 at Junction 14 and travel north towards Newport Pagnell on the A509. Turn right at the Tickford Roundabout, remaining on the A509, and follow the dual carriageway to the top of the hill. At the Chicheley Roundabout, go straight over and continue on the A509, bypassing Sherington and Emberton, finally crossing the river bridge into Olney.

## By Car from the North

- From **Wellingborough**, enter the town from the north on the A509.
- From **Bedford**, take the A428 west through Bromham and Turvey. Turn right on to the B565. Follow this road all the way to the Whirlypits Roundabout and turn left into the town.
- From **Northampton**, take the A428 east towards Bedford. Just after Yardley Hastings, turn right on to the B5388. Follow the road into Olney.

## Parking

Olney has ample free street parking. Car parks are also situated at the Old Cattle Market at the eastern end of the Market Place and off East Street, behind Fountain Court. The Market Place itself is available for parking except on Thursdays (Market Day) and the first Sunday of every month (Farmer's Market).
